

Key Truth - As children learn about birds, they will praise their Creator, trust the Bible, and know the creatures of this world couldn't have just happened. They were designed by God.

Needed Supplies in kit

- a. 2 handouts, one of birds' beaks and one of birds' feet in kit
- b. 4 pieces of Swedish fish, individually wrapped in kit
- c. toothpicks, bug net, plastic tweezers, straw in kit
- d. Optional, you provide Strainer and nutcracker or pair of pliers, whatever you have at home
- e. Bible glasses, 1 per child, from day 1
- f. Optional, a Bible to look up verses

Today we look at birds' beaks and feet and how their design enables them to find food and eat in specific ways. When we discuss the six types of beaks, give each child the toothpick, bug net, tweezers, straw, strainer and a nutcracker or pliers. While we are discussing a beak, encourage them to decide which of these items functions most like the beak being discussed. The Swedish fish can be used as the food the beaks are trying to capture/eat.

Needed supplies

- a. Bible glasses, 1 per child any toy or sunglasses available at home
- b. A Bible to look up verses
- c. A toothpick, net, tweezers, straw, strainer, nutcracker or pair of pliers
